- Ballots mailed to more than 1.8 million active registered voters
- 184 Vote Centers
- 23 Drive-Thru Drop Off Locations
- 5 Pop-Up Voting Events
- 123 Drop Boxes





2024 Presidential General Election

What 172 offices were on the ballot?

- Party nominated election for U.S. President and Vice President
- Voter nominated elections for U.S. Senator (partial & full term), Congressional Representatives, State Senate, and Assembly
- Nonpartisan elections for County First District Supervisor; City offices; School District offices; Special District offices; and 10 State and 30 Local Measures.

573 unique ballot styles and 614 Candidates (362 Statements)



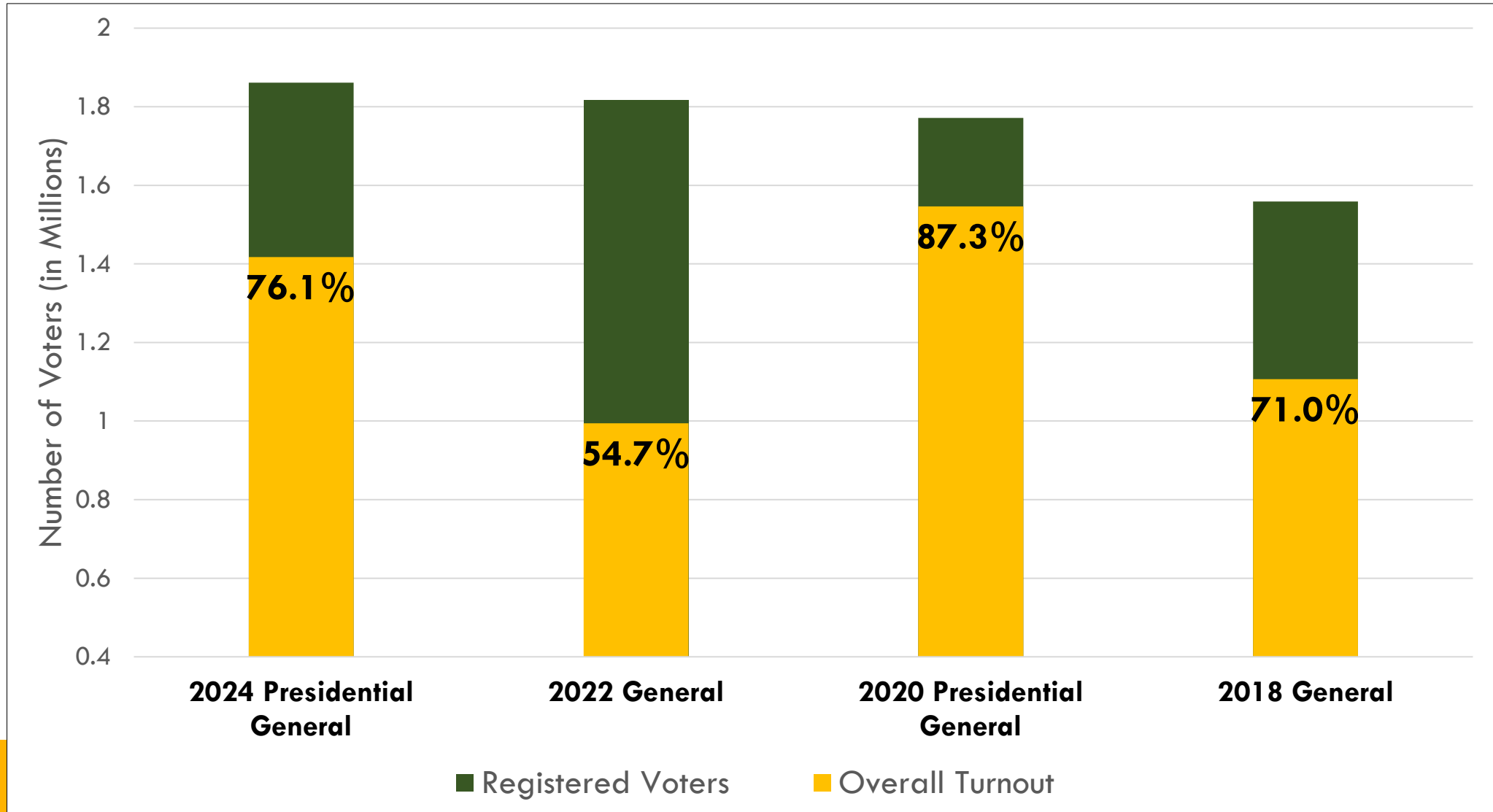
2024 General Election – Turnout

 - 323,223 ballots cast in person

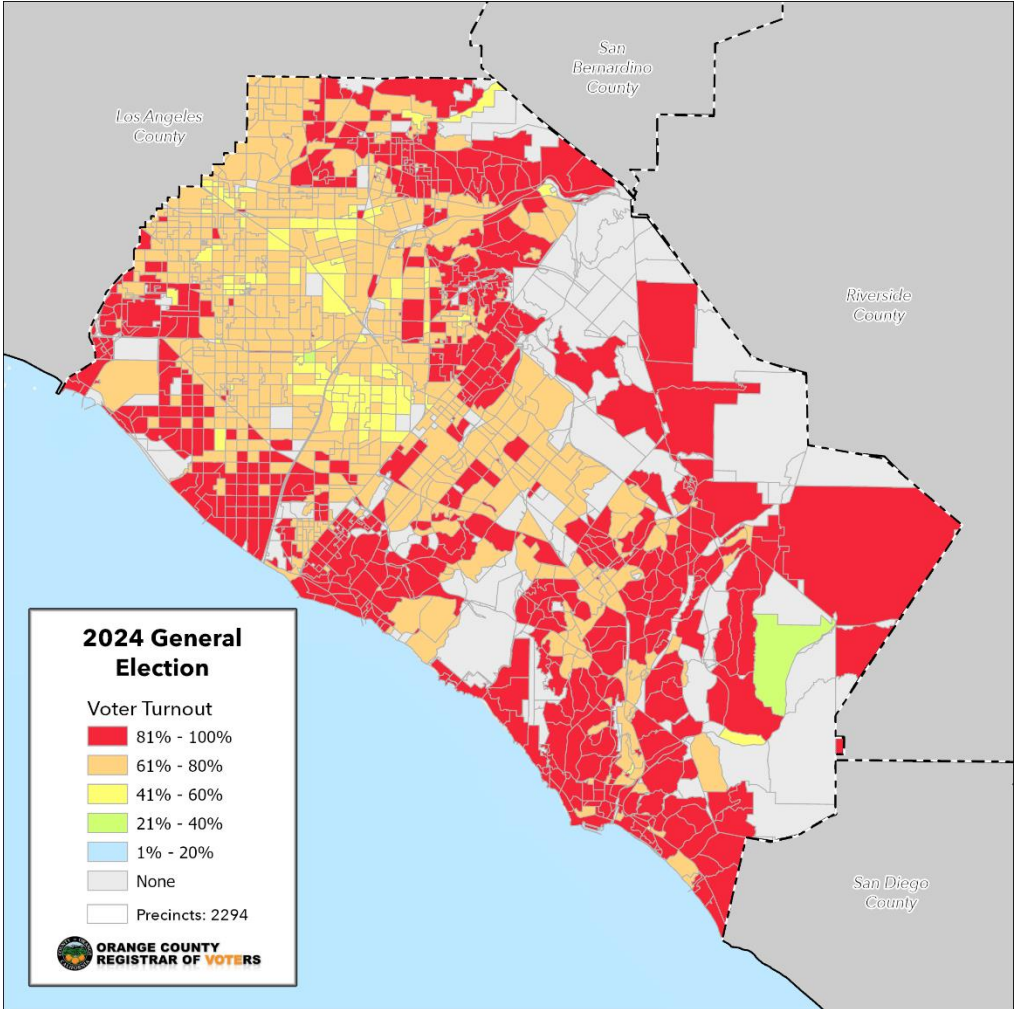




2024 General Election – Overall Turnout

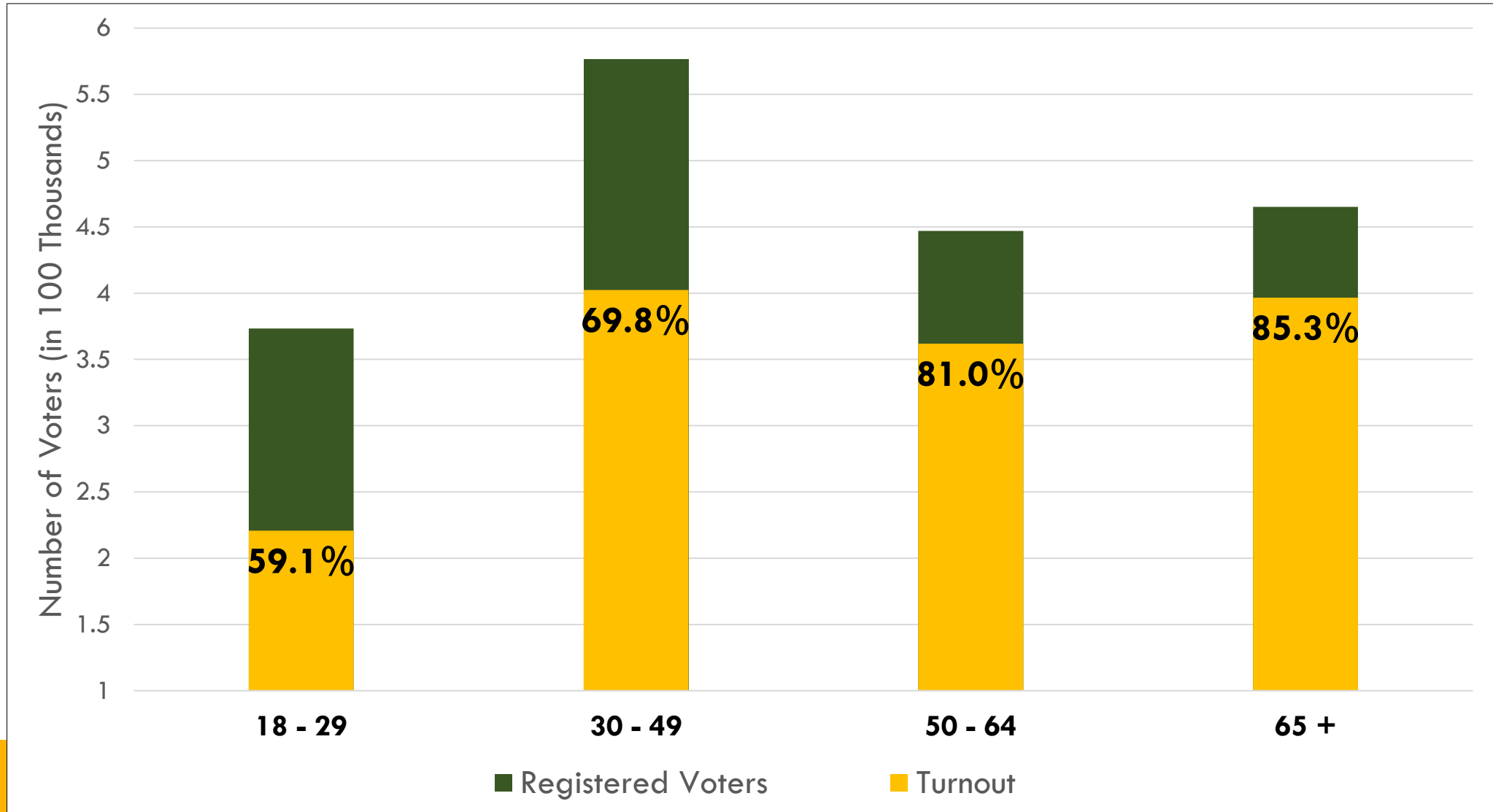


Voter Participation in Orange County

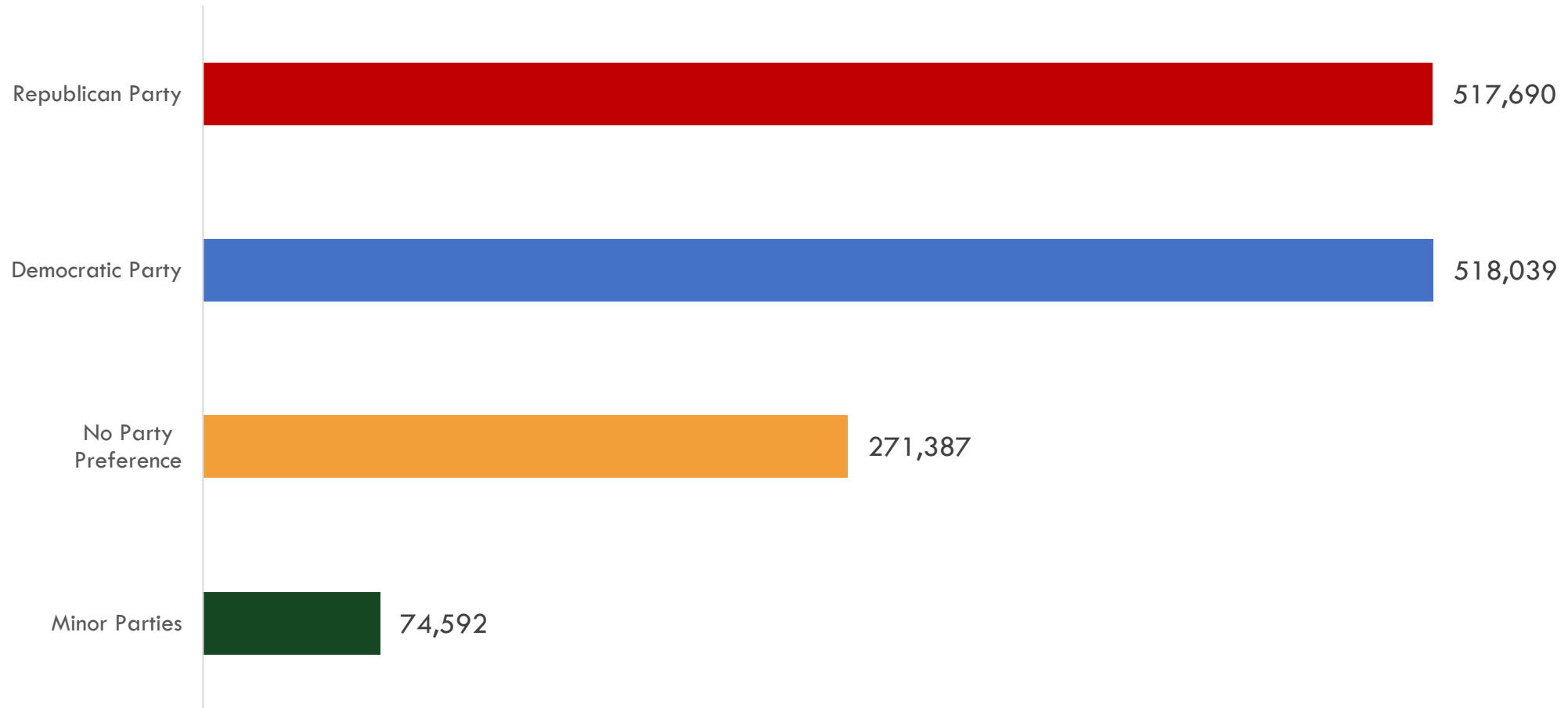
38,804 Total Provisional Ballots Cast

 - 13.4% of provisional ballots at 6.5% of Vote Centers

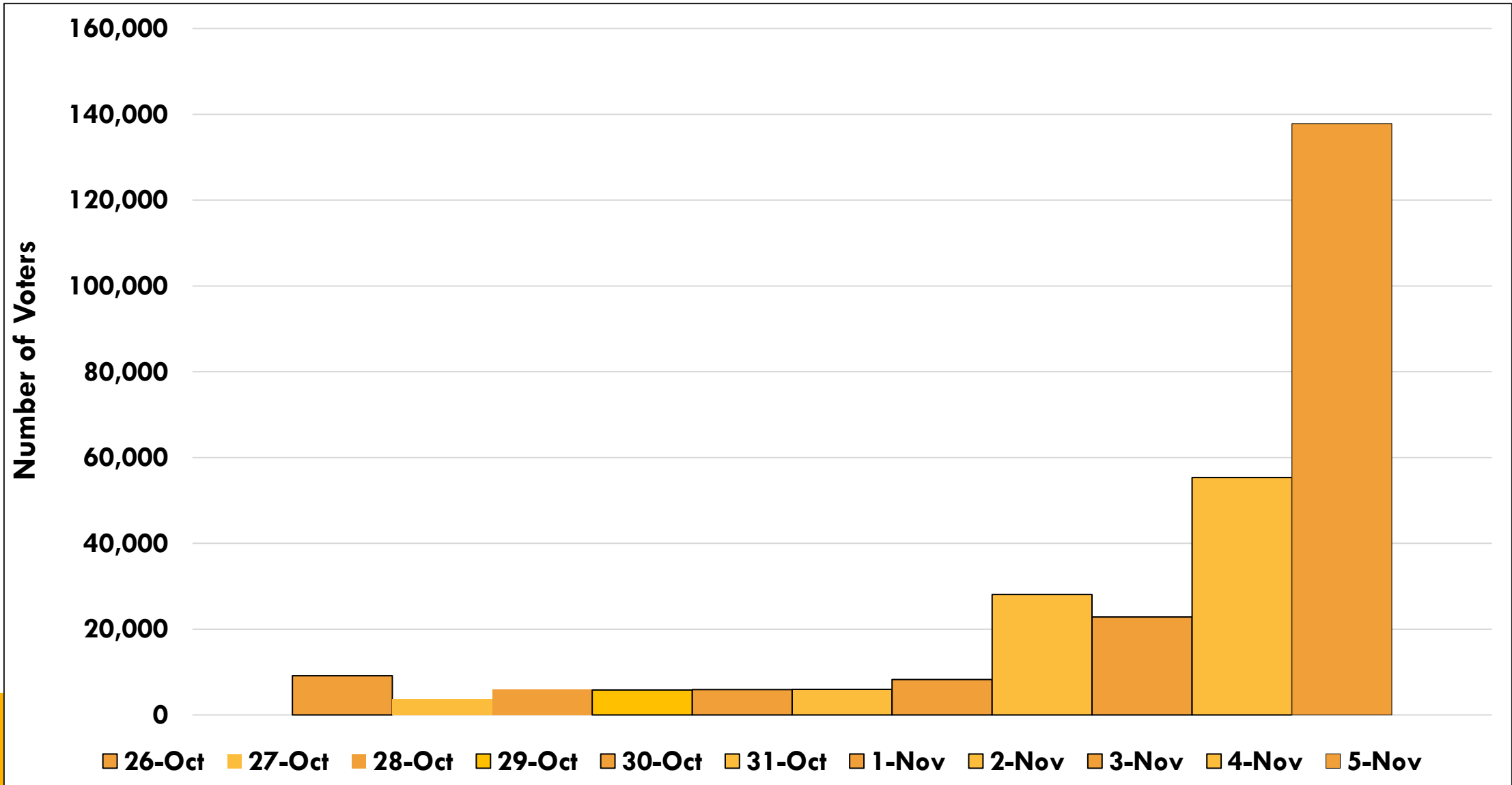

November 2024 General – Turnout by Party

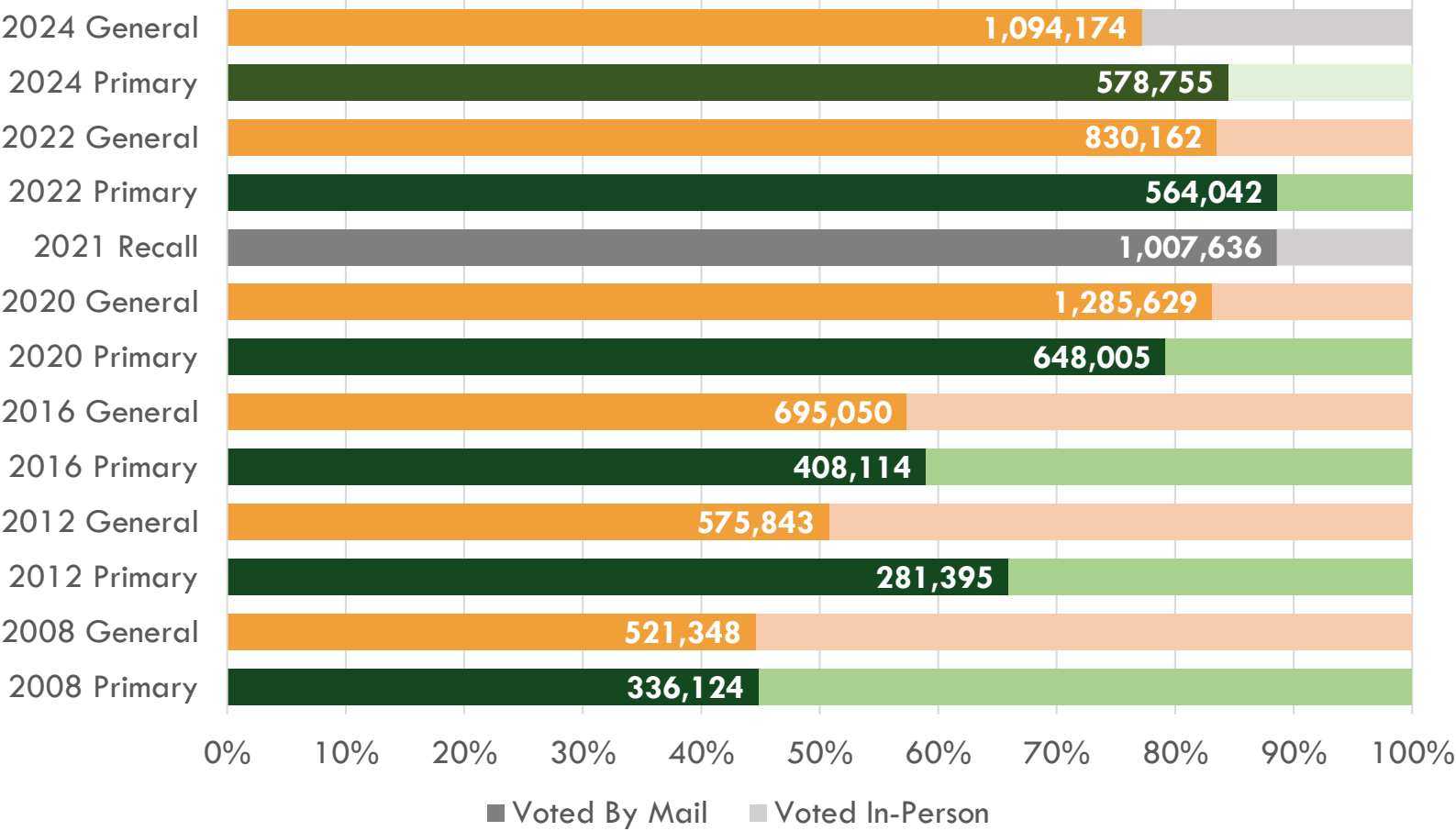


2024 General Election – In-Person by Date

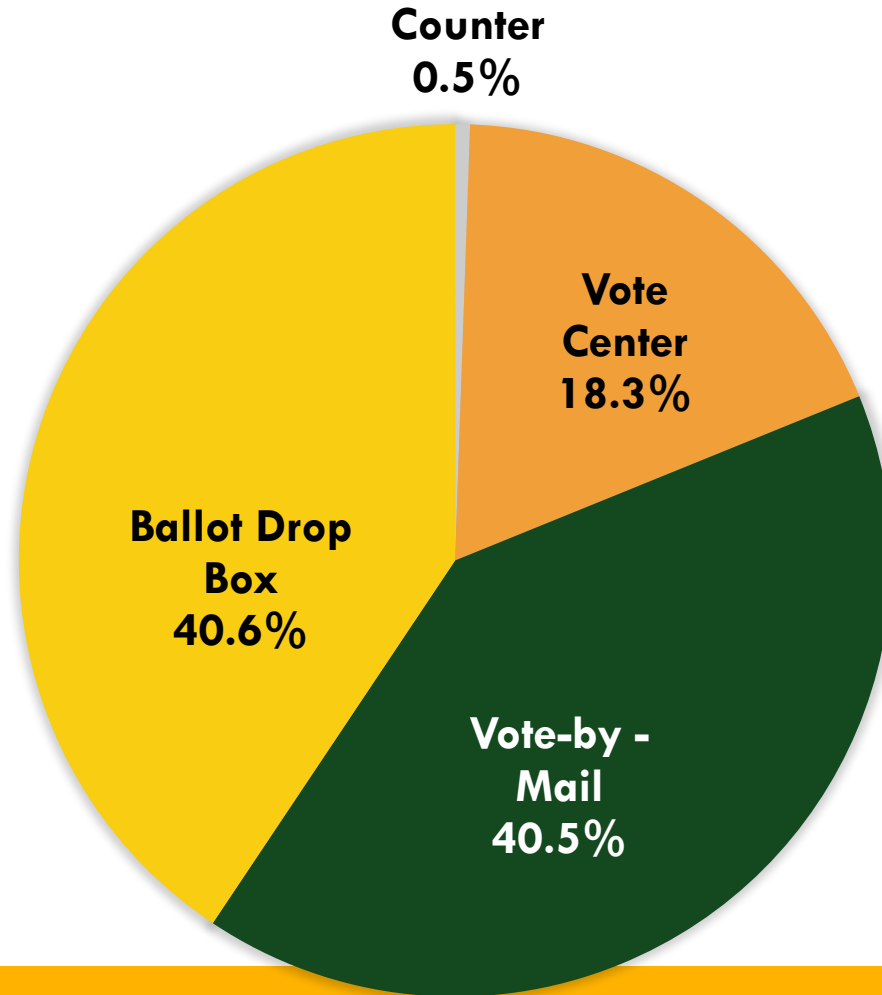




Vote-By-Mail vs. Vote Center Participation

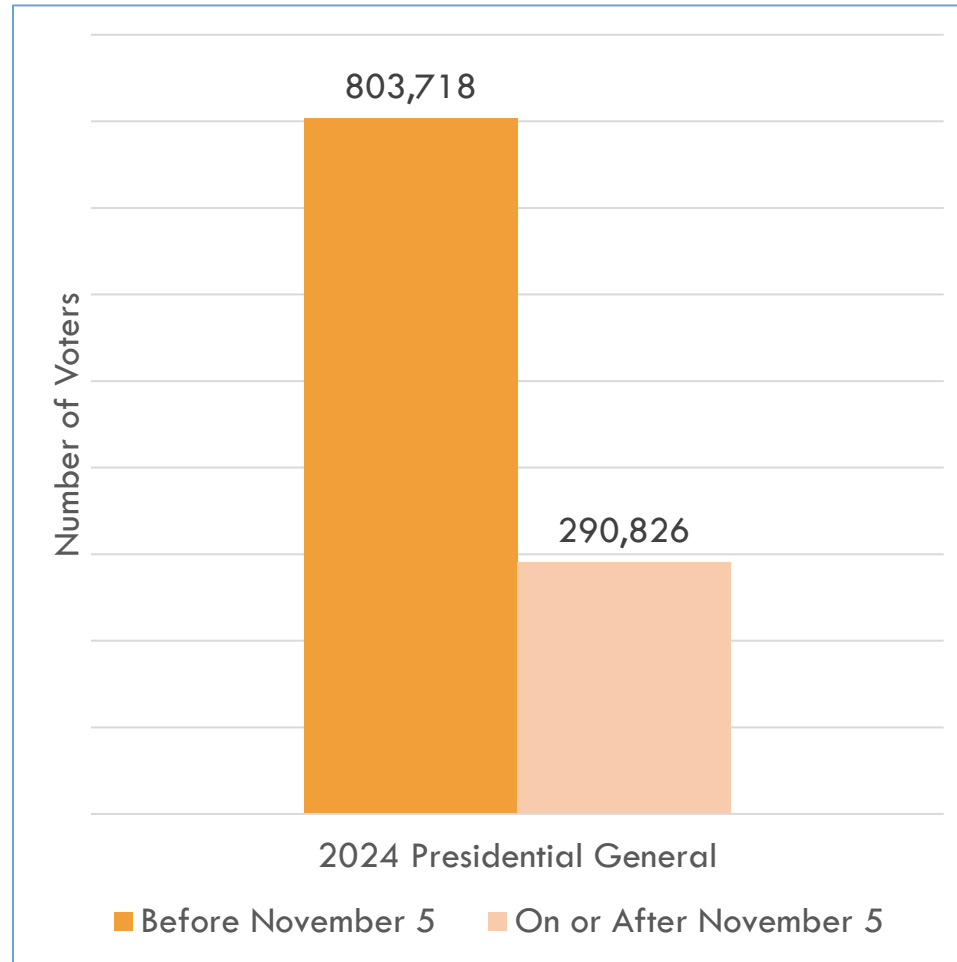


2024 General Election – VBM Return Method





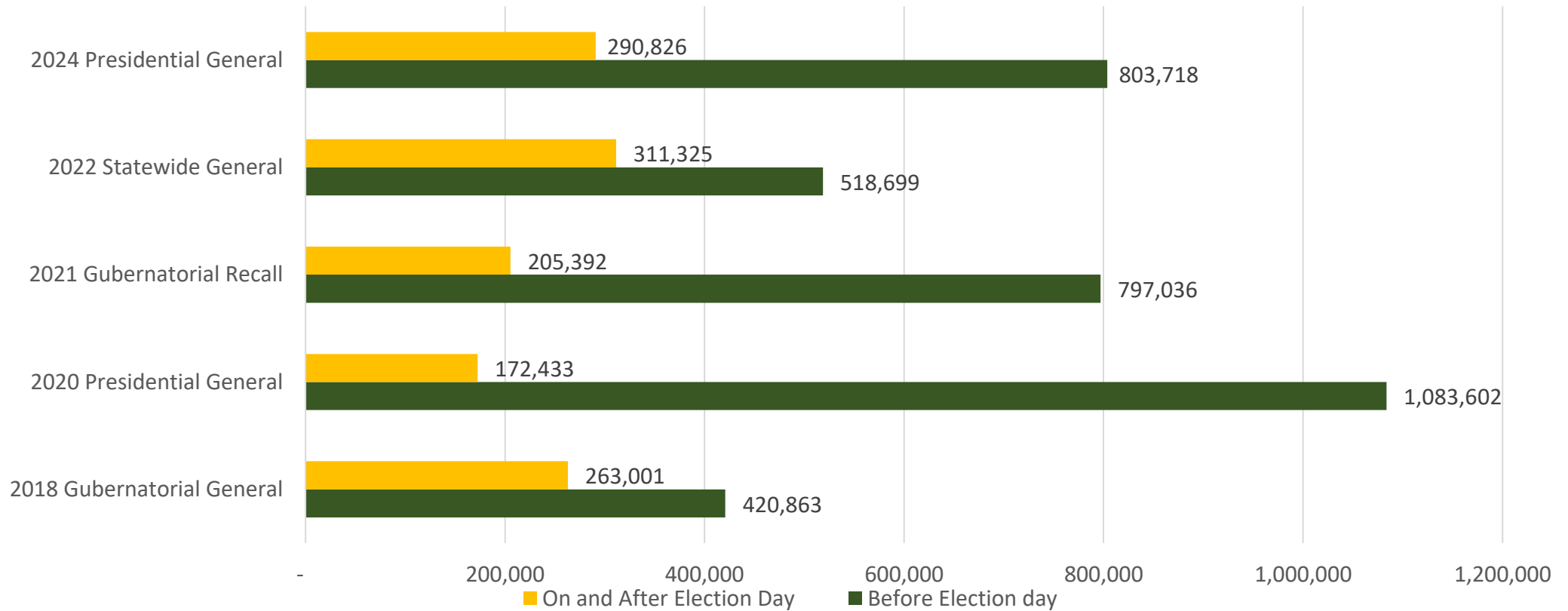
VBM Returned Before/After Election Day

Building Ballot Processing Capacity

- County invested \$4.1 million on Vote-By-Mail ballot processing equipment in 2023
- Results in 2024 Presidential General Election
 - Early ballots in drop boxes started process same-day
 - 89.3% of early ballots in first results (up from 85% in Nov. 2022)
 - By E+3, counted 81% of all ballots (up from 72.5% in Nov. 2022)



Speed of the Count

- Completed signature verification of VBM ballots by **E+8**
- Since 2018, completed VBM ballot signature verification from **E+7 to E+10**
- All canvass activities completed by **E+22**, except new cures
- Since 2018, certified General Elections from **E+22 to E+24**



Assembly Bill 3184 (Berman)

- Added urgency provisions specific only to the 2024 Presidential General Election regarding deadlines for Vote-By-Mail signature cures and completion of the canvass.
 - Signature Cure Deadline – Sunday, Dec. 1 (E+26)
 - Certification Deadline – Tuesday, Dec. 3 (E+28)
- Added about **850 cured** VBM ballots to results after E+20

2025 State Legislative Session



- At least four bills in Sacramento express an intent to address the speed of vote-by-mail ballot processing
 - AB 5, AB 16, AB 25, and SB 3
- California law prioritizes access, accuracy, and participation
- Will the Legislature shorten the time for
 - voters to cast a vote-by-mail ballot,
 - the USPS to deliver the ballots to counties, or
 - voters to cure a ballot with a challenged signature?

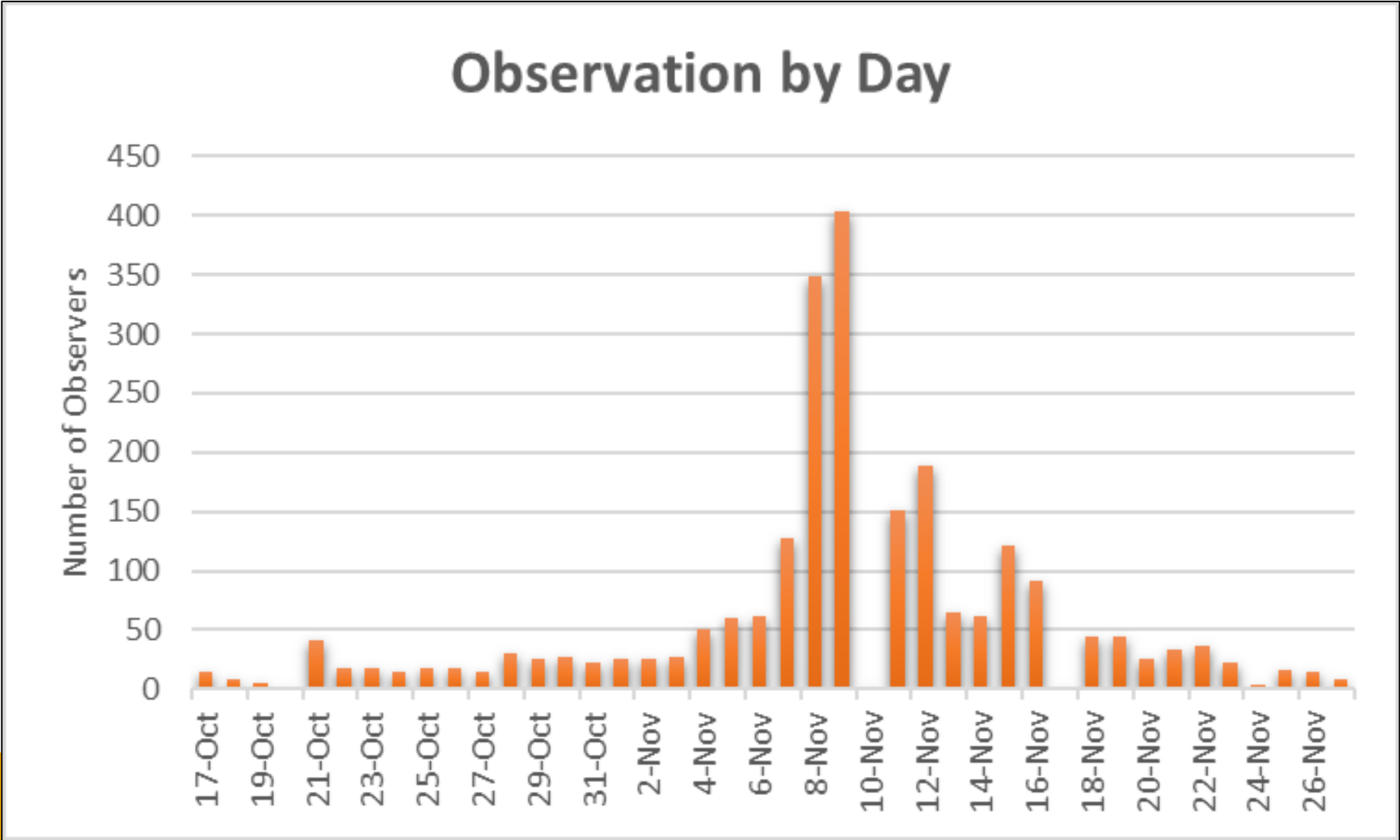


Large Number of Observers

- Due to high observation interest, Registrar of Voters on November 9 started to limit the number of observers during each two-hour ballot processing period.
- More than 2,300 observers visited the Registrar of Voters from October 5 to December 2.
- More than 400 observers visited the Registrar of Voters to observe on November 9.



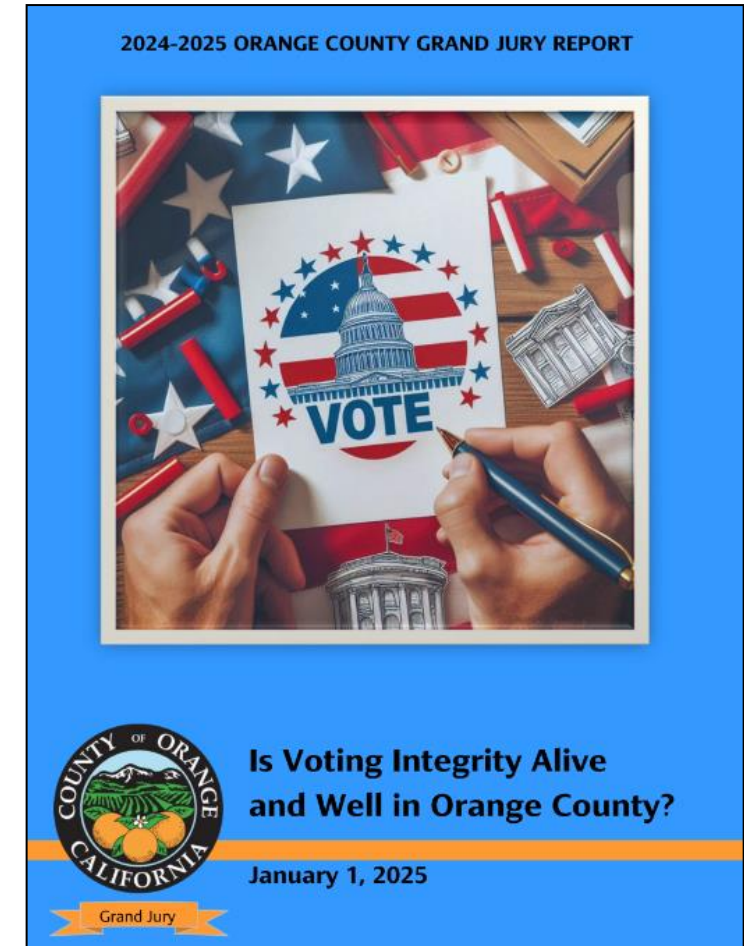

How we protect ballots:

-  We use **Two Person Integrity** - every time we collect voted ballots from Vote Centers, ballot drop boxes, and the USPS we transport them using **teams of two**
-  We **verify voter signatures** on all vote-by-mail ballots & notify voters if there is an issue
-  We **count your vote** using **state-certified** election equipment and software tested each election here in **Orange County**
-  We **hand tally all ballots from at least 1% of all precincts** - randomly selected - to ensure the election equipment is **accurate**



Security and Integrity Measures



Security and Integrity Measures

The Orange County Registrar of Voters takes election integrity very seriously and completes numerous steps to protect the County's state-certified voting system and ensure it accurately counts votes.



Security and Integrity Measures

- After the voting system was certified, Secretary of State staff hand-delivered the voting system software to the Registrar of Voters. This golden image software is loaded onto all voting system equipment before each election and removed from the equipment after the election. We confirm the software has not been modified before and after each election.



Security and Integrity Measures

- We run test ballots through each ballot scanner we use in an election to ensure each scanner is working properly and accurately counting the votes on the test ballots. This Logic and Accuracy Test is conducted before and after each election.



Security and Integrity Measures

- Every voter casts a paper ballot so that we can confirm the accuracy of the voting system. During the canvass period of each election, the Registrar of Voters hand counts all of the ballots in at least one percent of precincts that are randomly selected to confirm the results of every contest on the ballot.



Security and Integrity Measures

- All voting system equipment is not connected to the internet, or any outside network for that matter. The Registrar of Voters complies with the requirements of Elections Code section 19205.



Security and Integrity Measures

- Running critical operations on the voting system requires dual factor authentication by the user – to know a password that the Registrar of Voters creates for each election and to have a physical key that is updated every time a new election database is created. The key must be inserted into a USB drive of a piece of voting system equipment at the same time the password is entered. The password is encrypted and is not stored in plain text.



Security and Integrity Measures

- The Registrar of Voters uses numbered security seals to cover every opening of each piece of voting system equipment. These seals are checked and logged daily by employees to prevent and detect tampering.



Security and Integrity Measures

- Entry to the Registrar of Voters central ballot processing operation is protected by security guards and Sheriff's deputies. The areas where we handle live ballots and tally the votes require security card key access, which is limited to a certain number of our employees.



Voter Registration File Maintenance

- Perform all daily maintenance activities required by law
- Perform additional discretionary activities, including
 - Identification of duplicate voter registration files
 - Access third-party data to identify possible voter changes
 - Encourage voters to re-register to update their information and signature



Voter Registration File Maintenance

- 2024 Performance Measurements:
 - 974,220 – Number of Voter Registration Updates
 - 35,689 – Voters canceled, including 16,742 deceased voter removals
 - Percentage of Vote-By-Mail Ballots Returned undeliverable
 - Primary Election – 1.6%
 - General Election – 1.7%

- Draft Plan – 14-Day Public Review
- Noticed Public Hearing with Registrar
- Revised Draft – 14-Day Public Review
- Secretary of State Approval (E-120)





Voter Experience Survey

- Partnered with CalTech
- Survey was distributed in January to a stratified sampling of voters after the election
- Questions were aligned with ones asked in other jurisdictions to allow for comparison
- Some questions were specific to method voter casts a ballot
- Data will help with decision making during EAP Update

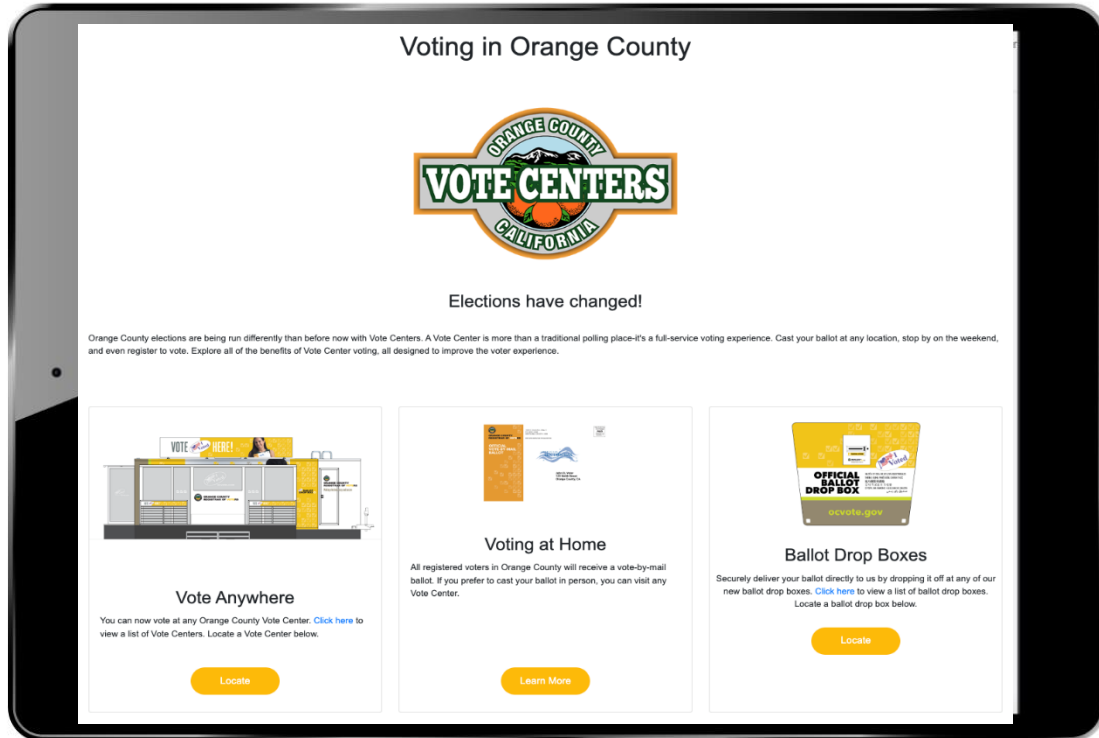

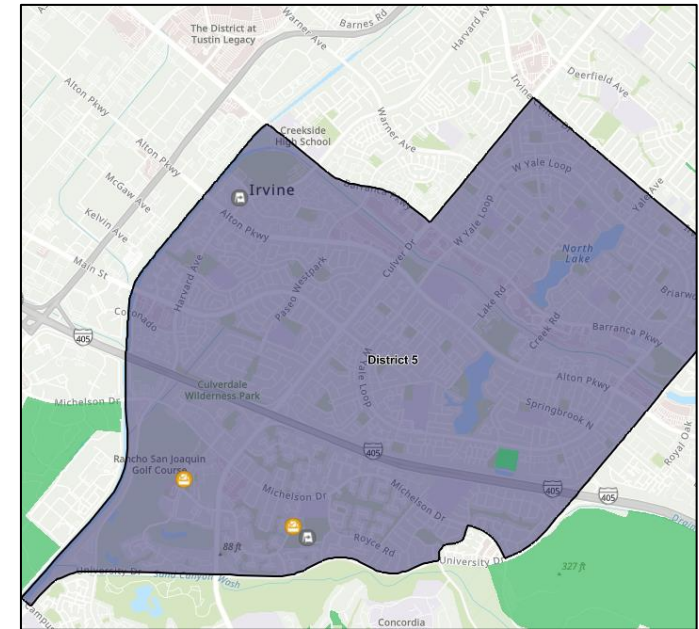

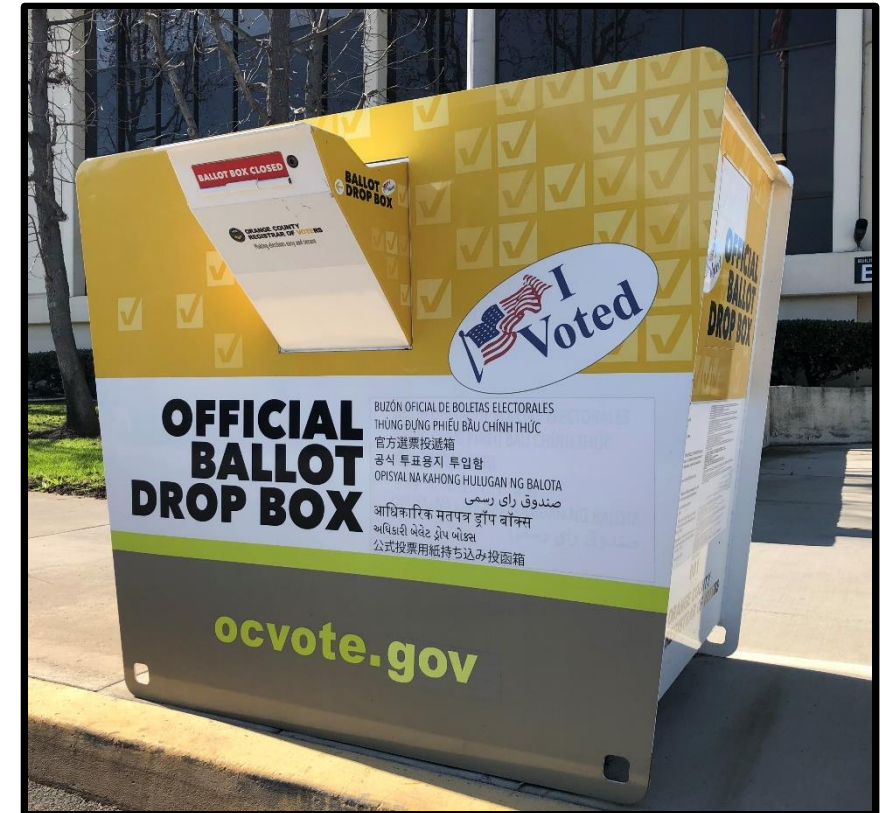

Security and Integrity Measures – Physical

- Badge access controls
- Auditable security seals on equipment
- Ballot drop boxes
 - Made of thick, secure metal
 - Bolted to concrete
 - Individually keyed





Security and Integrity Measures - Technical

- Electronic voter check-in with near real-time updates
- Voter data is secured and encrypted while in transit and at rest
- All votes are cast on paper ballots
- Pre- & post-election confirmation of voting system software version
- Vote tally system is not connected to the internet
- Intrusion detection/prevention systems in place

Security and Integrity Measures – Process



- Voter File Maintenance – Regular and consistent
- Ballot Handling – Daily randomized routes, GPS tracking, radio communication with controlled chain of custody
- Signature verification of all vote-by-mail ballots
- Pre-election & post-election Logic and Accuracy tests
- 1% Manual Tally and Risk Limiting Audit
- Partnerships – Federal, State, and Local law enforcement & DA



Security – Chain of Custody

- Strict chain of custody procedures are followed
- Observable by the public; it's done in plain view
- Chain of custody applied to voting equipment immediately after testing



Security – Chain of Custody Drop Boxes

- Teams of two used for ballot pickup
- Tracked using GPS for every pickup
- Radio and photo communication
- Upon return, ballot bag seals are verified, and ballots are immediately stored in secure location

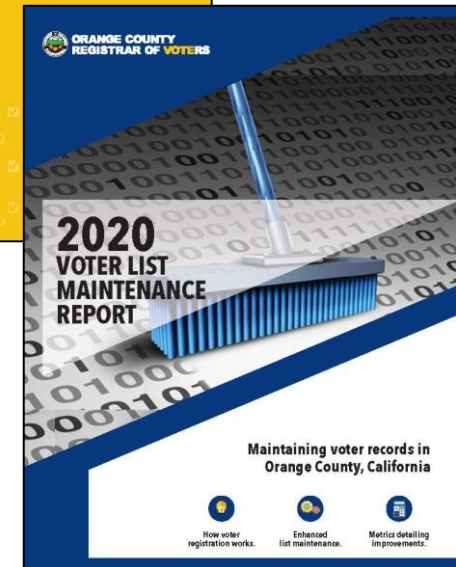
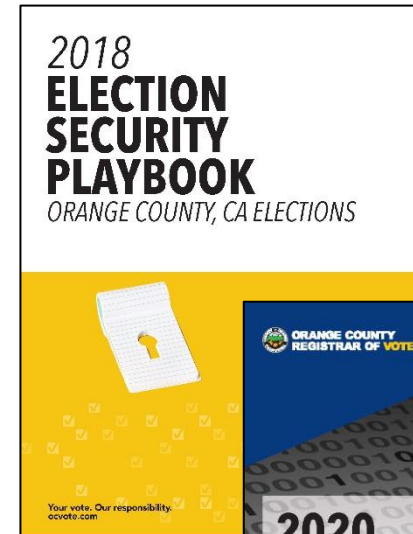
